## **Budget (Eric)**

- Discussed a few of the proposed changes for the Budget.
  - Previously we budgeted \$40,000 for Foreign Language Supplement. Now we are replacing that line with a Fine Arts instructor. Jessica will elaborate.
  - Field work/Intensive line we propose an increase
  - The \$20,000 that was previously budgeted for Fitness Reaction will now go to Professional Development (a 2-week development/training program for WESS teachers (like a retreat). Includes travel to Boston.
     Very beneficial for teachers.
  - After school equipment budgeting a little more
  - Most significant item Starting in Sept 2018, we begin our high school sports program, which is run by PSAL. However, PSAL will not cover the costs until year 3. That total amount needed is approximately \$90,000/year. The PA Exec Board is proposing that the PA help fund our sports program by splitting it with the school for now. Proposal means PA spends sapproximately \$40,000 \$45,000/year for 2 years. This will mean budgeting \$20,000 plus another \$20,000 from our surplus. (See Jessica comments below).
  - We will discuss all of these items at our next Exec Board meeting. And then we will present to you our final budget proposal at the June PA mtg.

#### **JESSICA JENKINS SPEAKS**

## 1. Our school/Our community

- I want to let everyone know that I am very cognizant of what's been happening in our district.
- Our school always was, and remains totally committed to inclusivity we encourage all students from across the district to apply to our school.
- We are constantly looking at how our school can do a better job in reflecting the diversity of our district and community.
- There have been some troubling comments made by community members about the district commitment to diversity. Our work must be about equity and access for all. Our job to make sure we are educating all children, regardless of academic level or socioeconomics.
- We want to start by initiating a <u>roundtable discussion among parents</u>, <u>bringing together</u> a diverse group. That group will include parents who don't necessarily come to the PA meetings. It is always important to keep in mind that we have parents who would like to be here at the PA meetings, but who are not able to attend.
- You will be receiving surveys from me about attendance at this roundtable discussion. I want to be strategic and make sure that we have our whole student body represented.
- Happy to have off line conversations about these tough subjects

## 2. Jessica on Budget Items

- Fine Arts: We will be hiring a Middle School Arts Teacher and a High School Arts Teacher
- PDP'S (Professional Development Plans): It's really helpful for the PA to help contribute / offset costs of staff professional development, i.e transportation, etc.

#### 3. Jessica on High School Sports

- o Shawn, our PE teacher, has experience in large, comprehensive high schools.
- PSAL (Public Schools Athletic League) won't fund us until our 3<sup>rd</sup> year of existence. That is why we have asked the PA to contribute \$40,000 \$45,000 per year. Once our current 9<sup>th</sup> graders reach junior year, PSAL will start to fund us and we will no longer need a contribution from the PA.
- Teachers get paid approx. \$50/hour. Shawn is hiring coaches who have extensive college and high school experience.

## **UPDATES ON ATHLETIC PROGRAM (Shawn Baumann)**

- Many parents have asked about our facilities, where our teams can practice.
- I had a meeting with the athletic director from Beacon HS (former tenants here). Turns out, he only had about one team practicing in this building. They

were borrowing churches, colleges, which is essentially what we are doing. In general, their teams performed well. We are currently using them as our model.

- Also had a meeting with the Athletic Director of John Jay.
- Reached out to coaches and teachers about what sports they are interested in.
- At some other schools, they have retired teachers do the coaching.
- Sending out a SURVEY to students REMEMBER one sport <u>per season</u>. PSAL RULE. THEY WON'T LET YOU PLAY MORE THAN ONE.
- In our first 2 years, we really need to show growth. That is key for PSAL to fund us in the 3<sup>rd</sup> year.

## **Q & A for SHAWN AND JESSICA**

Q: WHAT ABOUT SWIMMING?

A: Swimming is not offered

Q: ARE HIGH SCHOOL SPORTS AND MIDDLE SCHOOL SPORTS DIFFERENT?

A: Yes, completely different

Q: What about FOOTBALL?

A: We will not have tackle football.

Q: WHAT IF YOUR KID PLAYS A SPORT THAT IS NOT OFFERED HERE?

A: The important thing is that your child is COMMITTED to the sport he chooses.

Q: DO YOU WANT PARENT VOLUNTEERS?

A: A parent can help with coaching. However, he/she cannot be the coach on record.

Q: WHAT ABOUT CHESS?

A (JESSICA): Chess will be a WESS club, but will be separate from a sports club.

## - FIRST VOTE (Regents Days):

- June 12 and 13: A large percentage of our 8<sup>th</sup> graders are taking regent exams. We want to treat it as a non-attendance day for 8<sup>th</sup> graders only.

## SECOND VOTE: NERDY DERBY - (Gretchen/ Andreas)

- A creative science project: a race track exploration: covers 2 yrs of science. It starts this year – for the current 7<sup>th</sup> graders
- We have a surplus (since we overbudgeted) so we have enough to fund it
- o Motion to approve transfer of \$1500 to funding of Nerdy Derby.

#### Q & A FOR JESSICA

Q: RE REGENT EXAMS: WILL STUDENTS BE FORCED TO STAY UNTIL 70 MINUTES ARE DONE, EVEN IF THEY ARE DONE EARLIER?

A: Families will be provided with this information in a detailed email.

Q: RE THE ROUNDTABLE DISCUSSIONS YOU MENTIONED EARLIER: IS THERE GOING TO BE A DESIGNATED BOARD? OR WILL THESE JUST BE DISCUSSIONS?

A: I think the parents at the table are going to take the lead on that. Bringing parents together is the start. These conversations can serve as the model for the district.

Q: IF WE CAN, SHOULD WE INVOLVE THE KIDS?

A: YES, absolutely. And believe me, they know a lot.

Q: IS IT TOO LATE TO PLAN AN END-OF-YEAR SOCIAL FOR 8<sup>TH</sup> GRADERS?

A: We have not planned one b/c we are a 6-12 school. Plus we;re also doing John Jay Passage Ceremony to celebrate the completion of Passages. But, it does seem like some parents are interested. Just make sure it's the kids who want this, not the parents!

Q: RE SCHOOL SECURITY: CAN WE GET A BUZZER FOR THE ENTRANCE?

A: Hate to say it, but that is a larger conversation. Changes are on the horizon. Unfortunately, the school cannot decide independently about things like buzzers. It's a DOE decision
